### A Note from the Executive Director

## CAAFI is looking to hire new personnel!

Further to the previous announcement about Chris Tindal's retirement, and as we pre-announced in 2Q of 2023, we are now in the process of adding CAAFI resources to help address the expanding scope of SAF development. We're seeking thought leaders who will further foster the development and commercialization of SAF, and ultimately help the entire U.S. aviation industry, government, and public meet the goals of the SAF Grand Challenge. On 22 Jan, 2024, everyone receiving this newsletter also received an email announcement of the job postings for one CAAFI Assistant Director (AD), and up to two Project Directors (PD). The role on which we are most focused at present is the AD role. The PD roles have similar knowledge requirements but will be more focused on specific project/task management and execution, and thus have less stringent expectations for industry experience.

#### Ask CAAFI

Question: What are CAAFI's priorities in 2024?

**Answer:** At the end of each year, the CAAFI Leadership team prioritizes CAAFI activities for the coming year.

We base this on feedback from the CAAFI Steering Group and membership, informal feedback from industry and partners, and on our own observations about challenges and needs in the marketplace. Based on this input, at a high level, CAAFI's goals and priorities regarding sustainable aviation fuels (SAF) remain similar to previous years, more details of which can be found here. They are:

- Reinforcement of the Value Proposition of SAF
- Enhancement of the SAF Fuel Qualification Approach
- Alignment of Efforts to Enable Commercial SAF Deployment
- Implementing and Sharing Best Practices
- Supporting the Implementation of the SAF Grand Challenge Roadmap

The <u>Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) Grand Challenge</u>
<u>Roadmap</u>, released by multiple agencies of the U.S.
Government, lays out the current state and future
research, analysis, commercial, and policy needs to
reach the SAF Grand Challenge Goals of three billion
gallons of SAF per year by 2030 and full replacement of
petroleum-based jet by 2050. In light of this effort,
CAAFI will continue to undertake activities supporting
these targets in 2024.

## SAF Grand Challenge (SAFGC) Update

In addition to the aforementioned DOE RFI, and the FAA NOFO, the agencies participating in the SAFGC are currently involved in multiple activities, e.g.:

- ⇒ The work on Inventory and gaps analysis of existing funded programs and how such efforts can be folded into SAFGC efforts or form the basis for execution of SAF GC tasks, is completed. This work will be summarized in a SAF Roadmap Implementation Framework Report targeted for publication in early 2024, as will a Biomass Supply Chain plan, and the awaited update of the Billion Ton study.
- ⇒ SAFGC progress report summarizing the progress under the 6 action areas in development and anticipated to be published in early 2024
- ⇒ SAFGC metrics tracking plan in development

- ⇒ SAFGC Roadmap Communication and Engagement Strategy in development
- ⇒ LCA IWG continuing to support deliberations on LCA methodology. This work led, in part, to the IRS release on <u>GREET modelling updates</u> issued 15Dec'23, with the modified GREET model intended for release in Mar'24.
- ⇒ Some SAFGC implementation measures have also provided updates to various industry events over the last several months.
- ⇒ Integration of Executive Order EO 14081 (Advancing Biotechnology and Biomanufacturing Innovation for a Sustainable, Safe, and Secure American Bioeconomy) with the work of the SAFGC

## Other CAAFI Team Highlights

#### Business —

New producers, new suppliers, new customers, and many adjacent participants continue to contact us for guidance and assistance (continuing on a weekly basis) or asking for introductions to others who can assist with their commercialization efforts. We would like to remind any producer of this available resource document: Guidance for Selling Alternative Fuels to Airlines. Additional tools can be found here. We are very pleased to see this continued level of engagement as we are now at more than 190

companies exploring SAF commercialization. Further, our latest roll up of intended U.S. SAF production capacity (with identified offtake partners) exceeds 2.0B gpy by YE 2028, with others working quietly in the background on additional capacity.

## Certification/Qualification —

The work of the Cert/Qual team is aligned with the activities of ASTM's aviation fuel subcommittee, the Aviation Technical Committee of the Coordinating Research Council (CRC), and the now completed National Jet Fuel Combustion Program. It is also supported by periodic OEM meetings in the US and UK and various ASCENT projects. The qualification process is described in a recently issued paper "Qualification of Alternative Jet Fuels". This paper may be found at the Frontiers in Energy Research Sustainable Aviation Fuels "Research Topic.".

The winter meeting of the ASTM Aviation Fuels subcommittee was held in New Orleans from 4-7 December.

- ASTM D7566-23b including a new Annex 8 for ATJ-SKA and iso-butene as an additional allowed feedstock for Annex 5 for ATJ-SPK, is now available.
- Shell announced that they are putting their technical efforts in advance of their IH<sup>2</sup> technology based Cyclo-paraffinic Kerosene (CPK-0) on hold until a commercial partner is identified.

Various qualification activities are in progress:

- ⇒ The Methanol-to-Jet (MtJ) ASTM task group working with the US Clearinghouse is in the process of collecting property data from fuel technologies advanced by Exxon-Mobil, Honeywell, and Topsoe.
- ⇒ Hydrodeoxygenation Synthetic Aromatic Kerosene (HDO-SAK) championed by Virent is working to address few remaining requests from the OEMs and expects to ballot a new D7566 annex in 2024.
- ⇒ Plastics-to-Jet Synthetic Kerosene with Aromatics (PTJ-SKA) promoted by OMV, working with the US Clearinghouse, is in the process of completing property data collection in support of their qualification via the Fast Track process for up to 10% blending.
- ⇒ Hydroprocessed Esters and Fatty Acids Synthetic Kerosene with Aromatics (HEFA-SKA) advanced by

Council of Scientific and Industrial Research The Indian Institute of Petroleum (CSIR-IIP) is completing initial reviews of their research report and proposed new Annex by the US Clearinghouse and J06 Chair before starting the OEM review.

In parallel, fully-formulated and paraffinic-only 100% Synthetic Aviation Turbine Fuel Task Groups are working to progress their efforts towards fully synthetic fuels.

Additionally, the interest in co-processing approaches continues and the related work is in progress. Task groups are working on pyrolysis oil co-processing and waste-plastics co-processing. Another effort is aiming to increase the lipids co-processing limit from a maximum of 5% to 30%.

We continued to see increased engagement from petroleum refiners and suppliers who are interested in increasing the types and maximum blend levels for SAF co-processing at existing refinery installations.

## State and Regional Projects

CAAFI principals continue to participate in and foster regional development activity, on feedstocks, supply chain analysis & establishment, and with various entities.

Previously outlined supply chain building efforts continue in FL, VA, CT, MN, SC and GA. Multiple activities are ongoing in WA state, reflecting the continued building of momentum on SAF that comes from collaboration between exploratory working groups, interested policy makers, academia and

industry. Tune in to CAAFI's next webinar to hear an example of such.
